

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE LABOR FORCE

In June 2020, the El Paso Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) unemployment rate was 0.5 points higher than the unemployment rate for the city of El Paso. El Paso MSA unemployment rate for the month of June falls to 9.9 Percent.

The unemployment rate for the city of El Paso in June 2020 was at 9.4% which signified a 4.6% decrease from the previous month. In addition, the unemployment rate for the city of El Paso increased by 5.5% since last year. The unemployment rate for the city of El Paso was higher than the unemployment rate for the state of Texas (8.9%); but lower than the National unemployment rate (11.2%). The unemployment rate for El Paso County in June 2020 was 9.9%, which was higher than the unemployment rate for the state of Texas (8.9%) but lower than United States (11.2%).



Labor Force for the Borderplex area (Brewster, Culberson, Jeff Davis, Hudspeth, Presidio and El Paso county) in June 2020 was 365,033, which indicates an increase of 6,249 from the previous month. Over the year, Labor Force <u>decreased by 4,436.</u>

The number of employed in the Borderplex area for the month of June 2020 was 328,961, which reflects an increase of 22,537 from the previous month. Over the year, the number of employed <u>decreased by 25,479.</u>

The number of unemployed in the Borderplex area for the month of June 2020 was 36,072, which indicates a decrease of 16,288 from the previous month. Over the year, the number of unemployed increased by 21,043.

UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIMANTS FOR BORDERPLEX REGION

JUNE 2020



Total unemployment claimants for the Borderplex region in June 2020 was 10,852. This reflects a decrease of more than 6,000 claimants from the previous month. The total number of claimants for the Borderplex region increased more than 10,000 from a year ago (June 2019).

The week that had the most claimants for the month of June 2020 was from 6/1 to 6/6 (2,503 Claimants).

The top three zip codes with the highest number of claimants were: 79936, 79938 and 79928.

The top three occupation categories with the most unemployment claimants were:

- (1) Food Preparation and Serving Related
- (2) Sales Related
- (3) Transportation & Material Moving

These three occupations represented 36% of the total number of claimants for the month of June 2020.


EMPLOYMENT PERCENTAGE CHANGE
